The coins with Tamil Brahmi legends are probably the earliest inscribed coins in South India. 'Peruvazhuti' refers to a Pandya king who, according to tradition, performed several Vedic sacrifices. His full name, as mentioned in songs of the Sangam literature, was Palyagasalai Mutukutumi Peruvazhuti.

The coin is counterstruck on a 'seated lion'-type coin of SiriSatakani of the Junnar series. The undertype is clearly visible through its outlines on both obverse and reverse. Naganika was the first indigenous Queen to have struck coins in her name, jointly with her husband SiriSatakani. Famous for the dedicatory inscription in the Satavahana family temple at Naneghat, she is known to have performed several sacrifices, including two *Ashwamedhas*. The figure of the horse on top of the sacrificial pillar clearly alludes to this important Vedic sacrifice associated with universal kingship and conquest.

'Jagattunga' or 'Tallest (by fame/valour) in the World' was a title held by more than one Rashtrakuta rulers. However, Govinda III appears to be the best fit for the purpose of attributing this coin. He was an illustrious king, credited with many victories, including those against the Pratiharas of Kannauj, the Palas of Bengal, the Eastern Chalukyas of Vengi and the Pallavas of Kanchi. The title 'Apratihata' or 'invincible' applied to him in the coin legend is therefore a very fitting acknowledgement of his triumphs.

Another significant characteristic of the coin is the pseudo- Arabic inscriptions on both sides. It is a well-known fact that the Rashtrakutas were friendly with the Islamic Caliphate of Baghdad. The backbone of their friendship was a thriving trade in horses carried out from ports on the Western Coast of India, which was under Rashtrakuta control. These horses proved crucial in the campaigns which the Rashtrakutas conducted against other ruling powers. There were even Arab colonies on the Western Coast and some Arabs had also entered Rashtrakuta service, as we know from copperplate inscriptions. Conceivably, many Arab gold coins must have arrived through the trade into India and they appear to have provided the design inspiration for Rashtrakuta gold coins.

The reign of Govinda III fits well with the heyday of this trade and the fact that he chooses to show him as a horse rider also befits the nexus established between the Arabs and the Rashtrakutas through commercial activities. The mention of 'Garuda-dhwaja' or 'Ensign of the Garuda' in the legend refers to the dynastic emblem of the Rashtrakutas, who were Vaishnavites and employed Garuda the bearer of Vishnu to show their devotion to their patron deity.

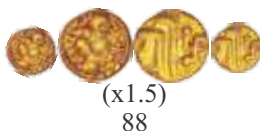

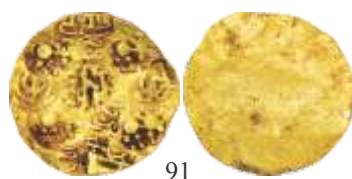

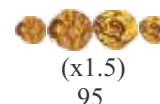

Coins of this type were previously listed as of 'Khitta Alwar' mint. However, on this specimen the mint-name is clearly written as 'Nagore' and not 'Alwar'. In retrospect, it is evident that the initial letter has a hooked base on all coins, and on some pieces offered earlier at our and other auctions there is a clear *nuqta* above the hooked end.

Nagore was an important place for Balban – during the early part of his career when he was effectively a co-ruler with Nasir al-din Mahmud, he held the iqta'a for the province of Nagore. At the beginning of his reign as a Sultan after the death of Mahmud, he made the fort a base for his campaigns into Sindh to tame various local rebels. It is possible that coins were struck here to finance the troops carrying out Western campaigns.

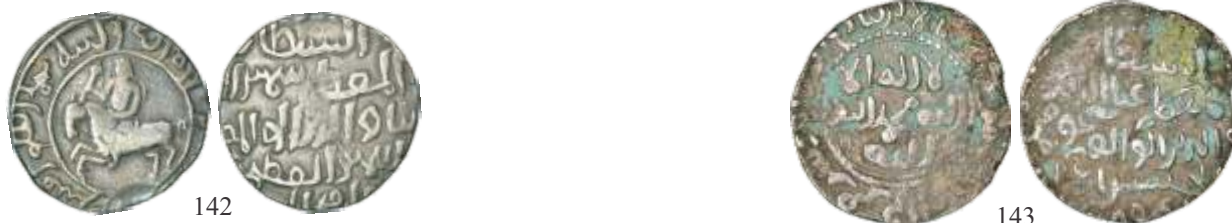

Jalal al-Din Mahmud was an ephemeral Sultan who appears to have seized power for a year or two, immediately after the death of Balban who quelled the rebellion of Mu'izz al-Din Tughril. It is possible that he was a son of Tughril and for at least one year, his coins struck at Lakhnauti overlap with the issues of Nasir al-Din Mahmud alias Bughra Shah, the son of Balban, suggesting a struggle for power in which Bughra Shah emerged successful. Jalal al-Din Mahmud's coins are struck from 'land tax of Banga', i.e. Eastern Bengal and it is likely that he launched raids in the province to bring forth tribute to stabilize his rule.

The coin is remarkable for the date and the symbol it bears which connect it to the rare issues struck by Meeran Muhammad Adil Khan of Khandesh struck during his short-lived rule as the Sultan of Gujarat, following the death of Bahadur Shah. While Muhammad's coins do not bear a mint-name, G&G have remarked that they might have been struck either in Malwa or at Burhanpur, the capital of Khandesh. The possible contenders for mints in Malwa would be Ujjain or Mandu.

Humayun had occupied Malwa shortly before and his copper coins of Ujjain and Mandu bearing dates AH941 and 942 are known. The style and the employment of the symbol make it clear that this Shahrukhi was also produced in the same workshop as that where coins of Meeran Muhammad Adil Khan were struck in the same year. As such this is an important coin for Humayun's Shahrukhi coinage. In the same year, he also struck Shahrukhis at Champanir.

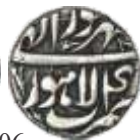

When Jahangir died on 28 Safar, AH 1037 in Kashmir, his powerful courtier Asaf Khan feared the Queen Nur Jahan would place on throne her favourite son Shahryar as the new king. He enthroned Bulaki, the son of Jahangir's second son Khusrau, as 'Dawar Bakhsh'. The Khutba was read in Dawar Bakhsh's name at Bhimbar. His position was bolstered by his brothers and cousins joining him. Asaf Khan first defeated Shahryar's army on the outskirts of Lahore and then having secured Shah Jahan's agreement, proclaimed him as the emperor on 2 Jumada-I 1037. The puppet Dawar Bakhsh was killed along with his brothers and cousins who had sided with him by Shah Jahan's orders on 26 Jumada-I 1037, thus bringing his short reign to an end.

Muhammad Shah Shuja's was appointed by Shahjahan as the *Subahdar* of Bengal and Bihar from 1641, and additionally, of Orissa from 25 July 1648. During his governorship, he built the official residence 'Bara Katra' in the provincial capital Dhaka.

After the illness of Shahjahan in September 1657, a power struggle erupted among his sons Shuja'a and Murad Bakhsh. Shah Shuja'a proclaimed himself as Emperor in Bengal and Bihar, and Murad declared his bid for power in Gujarat. Aurangzeb initially backed Murad, but later cunningly eliminated him to ascend the throne at Agra. He then sent Mir Jumla to subjugate Shuja'a. Shuja'a was defeated in the Battle of Khajwa on 5 January 1659. He retreated first to Tandah and then to Dhaka on 12 April 1660. He left Dhaka on 6 May and fled towards Arakan with a fleet of boats. Mir Jumla reached Dhaka on 9 May 1660 and was then appointed by Aurangzeb as the next Subahdar of Bengal.

Shuja'a struck coins from three mints - Akbarnagar, Katak and Patna, the last two being extremely rare with only one piece known so far of each. A rupee of Patna mint is listed on www.zeno.ru as Zeno #137500. The mint-name is engraved in the left margin with only one *nuqta*, that of the final 'noon'. The same *nuqta* is clearly visible on this coin, which confirms it as an issue of the same mint. A comparison with Zeno #204139, a rupee of Akbarnagar mint of the same type, shows that the *shosha* of 'K' in the mint-name and the letter 'Alif' preceding it, occupy the same space. Evidently therefore, the mint-name on this coin is not Akbarnagar. Additionally, the layout and engraving style of the coin is similar to the 'Zeno' specimen of Patna - the only difference being the placement of the RY, which on the 'Zeno' coin is placed outside the rectangular margin, whereas on this coin, it is placed inside it.

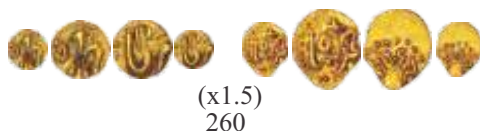

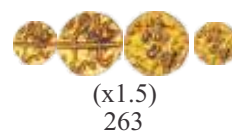

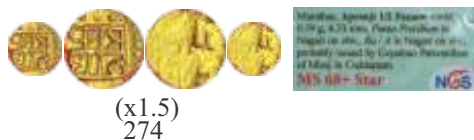

Nimakshahi Rupees have proved rather enigmatic ever since Rodgers wrote about them. He read the mintname on these coins as nimak, which means salt and attributed the rupees to a mint at Pind Dadan Khan, a town at the foot of the Salt Range. This reading was noted with some scepticism as having the name of a commodity as a mintname would be most unusual. Jyoti Rai in ONS 143 demonstrated that the British had requested the Lahore Durbar to establish a mint at Pind Dadan Khan for the recoinage of light-weight Afghan Rupees which were circulating in the area. This mint was in operation from October 1847 to late 1848 which corresponds with the dates found on the Nimak Rupees.

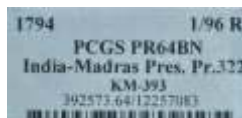

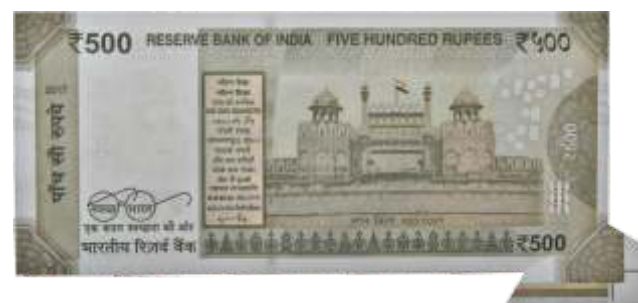
